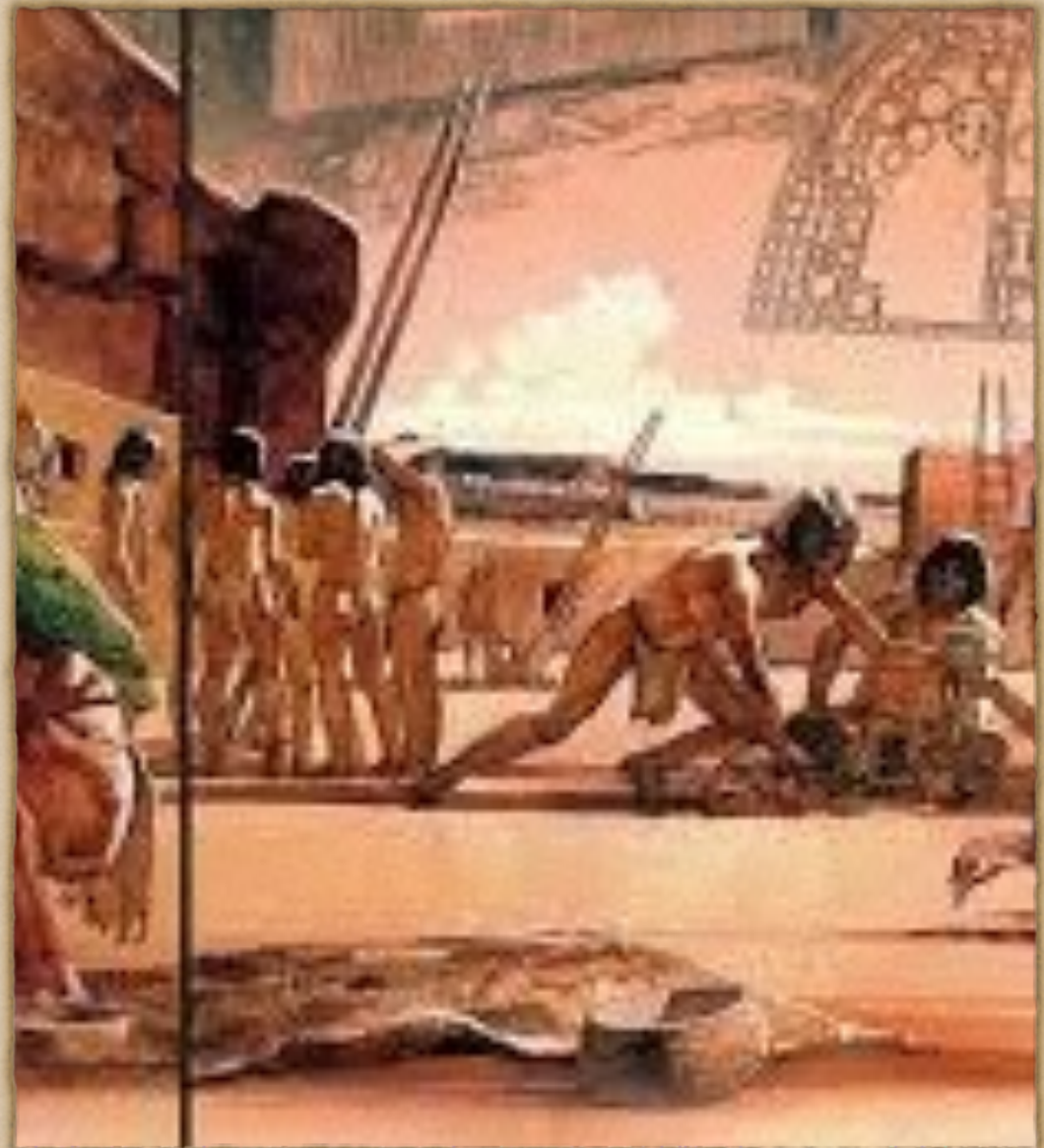

Key Points:

- ◆ It was extremely hot in the summer, which was followed by frigid winters
- ◆ The natives were Hopí and Zuni, over time they referred to the Pueblo People.
- ◆ They lived in what is now Arizona and New Mexico
- ◆ They lives on Pueblos built on mesas, or sides of steep canyons
- ◆ Their main foods were maize, beans, and squash. Even in their dry environment they still were able to grow their crops.

Main Idea

- ◆ The Pueblo People adapt to their environment by using the natural resources. The Puebloans also adapt to their new lifestyle and their climate.



(continued) Key Points

- ◆ Puebloans used mud and stones to make their pueblos, or homes, other natives used adobes, or sun dried bricks made of clay mixed with straw.
- ◆ To make the beams of their houses they used pine and juniper trees. They traveled long distances to get them.
- ◆ In order to survive their main natural resource was mesas. They built pueblos, irrigation canals, and they grew their crops at the bottom of the mesas too.

Vocabulary

- ◆ Canals: According to the oxford dictionary on the laptop the meaning of canals is an artificial waterway constructed to allow the passage of boats or ships in land or to convey water for irrigation
- ◆ Juniper: an evergreen shrub or small tree that bears berrylike cones, widely distributed throughout Eurasia and North America.



(continued) Vocabulary

- ◆ Mesas: an isolated flat topped hill with steep sides found in landscapes with horizontal strata, (a layer or series of rock in the ground)
- ◆ Irrigation: to supply water to land or crops to help growth typically by means of channels.

- ◆ Beams: A long, sturdy piece of a squared timber or metal spanning an opening or part of a building usually to support the roof or floor above
