
4th-6th grade students who received "Exceeded" on both CAASPP ELA & MATH = Automatic Qualification

Can test every year from 3rd through 6th grade if they don't pass but still score "Met" or "Exceeded on the CAASPP tests


GATE projects only administered during 4th-6th grade
